**Recondita Armonia** From Puccini's opera *Tosca*; Cavaradossi the artist sings of the differences between his painting of a fair Madonna and the darker beauty of his love, Tosca.

**Eli Jenkin's Prayer** The soliloquy by the Rev Eli Jenkins from "Under Milk Wood" written by Dylan Thomas. Music by Arthur H.D. Troyte.

**The Anthem** From the musical "Chess" by Benny Andersson/Tim Rice/Bjorn Ulvaeus, arranged for male choir by Jonathan Gulliford.

**Tydi a Roddaist** Entitled a part song for Male Voices, regarded as a Welsh hymn. Music Arewl Hughes, words T. Rowland Hughes.

### SOPHIE GOPSILL

**Lascia ch'io Pianga** From Handel's opera *Rinaldo*, sung by Almirena; the first Italian opera composed for the London stage in 1711.

**Bésame Mucho** Consuelo Velazquez – "Kiss me much" – a Mexican song that has been used in many film scores.

**Katyusha** A very well-known Russian folk song.

### MARCEL XERRI

**Nessun Dorma** (sung with Cwmbach Male Voice Choir) The most memorable tune from Puccini's opera "Turandot". Arranged by Frank Smith.

**Because** Turn of the century love song by Helen Rhodes who composed under the name Guy d'Hardelot.

**Core 'ngrato** Neapolitan song by Cardillo – Catari is the 'Ungrateful Heart' who after receiving so much love gives nothing in return.

**Torna a Surriento** Neapolitan song by De Curtis – The Neapolitan implores his sweetheart to stay with him in his beloved Sorrento.
